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
Camelot block party

Warfare and His Word

Last month I gave a primer of sorts on the book of Ecclesiastes. While we still have several months left in the Pastoral Epistles, I have been reading through Ecclesiastes and other resources to help prepare us for this series. I trust you, too, are wading through this most intriguing Old Testament book as well.

In this *Current* article I hope to encourage you with what I believe is a most common struggle every believer has every day of the week. This struggle is not just daily but, often, moment-by-moment. And I believe we are often not even aware of the struggle that is going on. I am speaking about the battle between truth and lies/deception.

The battlefield takes place in the mind and is such an "ordinary" battle, we are often unaware of the daily attrition that takes place in our lives from its debilitating effects. I believe that the most common "spiritual warfare" takes place not over some dastardly dynamic demonic activity in our lives, not over some "big" flashy sin we are tempted to indulge in, but in the trenches of the Truth — whether or not we will believe God and what He says, or, whether we imperceptibly believe and then walk in the lies of the evil one.

I suppose you've heard much of this before, but let me try to explain what I mean by all of this. I'll start out with how I woke up this morning! I wasn't even out of bed, barely awake, and yet these negative condemning thoughts are creeping in. I was discouraged before I ever placed a foot on the floor. Where did all that come from? It came from lies I started to believe about myself, and these lies came from a ruthless killer — the father of lies.

Concerning the devil, Jesus told the Jews of His day: "He was a murderer from the beginning, not holding to the truth, for there is no truth in him. When he lies, he speaks his native language, for he is a liar and the father of lies." (John 8:44) I remember hearing years ago that the only power the devil has is in the lie. If the accuser of our brothers and sisters (Rev.12:10) can get us to believe his lies, then we will walk around deceived, divided, and discouraged. The "antidote" to the lie, of course, is the Truth.

When the devil lies to us (even before we get out of bed in the morning!), we fight the lies with the Truth of God. This is what Jesus did when He was tempted in the wilderness (Matt. 4:4ff). The devil is deceptive in that he actually (mis)quotes Scripture when he attacks us. We need to know the Word so well that our defense will always be "It is written . . ." (Matt.4:4, 7, 10). Returning again to John's Gospel, we read: "To the Jews who had believed him, Jesus said, 'If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." (John 8:31-32)

This battle for our spiritual freedom is so intense, so daily, so "mental," that we must, along with the Apostle Paul, learn how to "take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ." (2 Cor. 10:5) Notice again, the mental "battlefield" that Paul mentions. We fight in the realm of arguments and knowledge.

Let me close this month with a simple appeal to each of us, that we would pray for a deepening desire to know whom we have believed. (2 Tim. 1:12) All of the Gospels and Epistles, indeed, all of the first covenant Scriptures are about our Lord Jesus, the One whom Paul believed (Luke 24:27). Yes, even the devil and his demons "know" and even "believe" certain theologically orthodox things about God (James 2:19), but it is not a saving knowledge. Their "knowledge" about God is all "head" and not "heart," It is "truth" twisted to their own demonic desires and ends, and therefore is not the truth at all. Truth is found, ultimately, in Jesus and the lived-out submission/trust we have in Him. (John 14:6)

So, the next time you are aware of the battlefield of the mind, perhaps before you even get out of bed in the morning, remind yourself of God's Truth! May you believe and walk in truths such as this: "In all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 8:37-39) That, my friends, is the Truth!

America has long been known for going forth to the ends of the earth, leaving extended family behind for a lifetime of service on the "mission field." The face of global missions has changed during the 21st century. Nowadays, Christian believers from all over the world are engaged in Gospel conversations, sometimes involving travel but also seeking to reach souls within their own culture. And in many cases, rather than settling into new cultures, American "missionaries" are networking with indigenous believers and training local leaders who haven't had the luxury of attending seminary.

We see this in certain of CrossWay's frontline workers, returning from long-term overseas assign-

Their trip is bearing fruit, as they are establishing a new partnership in bringing the Gospel to the Banjara, gypsies in India who number some 80 million with just .05% identifying themselves as believers in Christ.
