Opportunity to bless

Tom and Dora B. were sent to the mission field in the Czech Republic more than 25 years ago. Their initial commitment led them into ministry to the Roma people at first in Europe and, more recently, around the world.

The 14 million Roma (commonly known a Gypsies) in Europe are descendants of the Banjara tribal people in India. With a history of enslavement and roaming, they are spread across Europe. Marginalization has sometimes sustained a cycle of poverty. Education and employment can break this cycle.



Tom and Dora have spent many years of working with the Roma and organizing a network of ministry leaders from the U.S. and abroad who similarly serve God by bringing the Gospel to them through word and deed. During April, Tom contacted us at CrossWay to bring our attention to a new opportunity to bless the Roma people in Latvia:

I wanted to let you know of a Gospel initiative called The HERO Project. It is a local church initiative in Latvia that uses social enterprise to connect with people, share the Gospel with them, and disciple them. They have seen some really good success in growing their church and discipling Roma believers. The HERO Project is designed to help the Roma in the area get and keep jobs. Latvia has a 70% unemployment rate among the Roma people, because they have not been integrated into society well. This project works with local churches, missionaries, and the labor department to provide job skills and an internship to increase their practice of the new skills. The men learn wood working and the women learn sewing.

We are raising another \$18,000 towards this project that could affect hundreds of Roma in Latvia (and other countries as we expand).

The program will be housed in the Roma Activity Center in Aloja, Latvia. The local church that meets there provides laundry and shower services, social support, counseling, education, and training. It has become a meeting place for the community.

This worthy project does not fit into the CrossWay missions budget. But if it moves your heart, you're welcome to donate individually.
